

Gramática 1

An **infinitive** tells the meaning of a verb without a subject (it's not conjugated). If a verb is conjugated, an infinitive follows instead of a conjugated verb.

Ie: A mí me gusta leer libros.

PRONOUNS

You already learned that you need to use a pronoun with gustar (me, te, le, nos, os, les). Sometimes pronouns need to be changed when they are after a **preposition**.

Prepositions include:

A (to), De (of), Con (with), En (in, on, at)

Instead of saying "A me" or "A te", we say "A mí" or "A ti"

The reason "a" is used is to clarify or emphasize who likes something.

QUERER=

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Just like gustar... If querer is conjugated, the verb afterwards is not conjugated.

Ie: Quiero comer.
