# Bienvenidos a la Clase de Español 1! Vestaburg High School 2017-2018 Profesora: Sra Davis

### **Course Description**

In this course, our goal will be to acquire Spanish language. When you learned how to speak your first language, you <u>acquired</u> it naturally by listening to other people speak it around you for a long time. Therefore, almost all of our class time will be spent using Spanish--not using English to talk about Spanish--and the focus will primarily be on listening and reading, but also speaking and writing which will come naturally as you take in more and more Spanish. This Spanish course is a Comprehensible Input Spanish course, and we will use methods and strategies that are based on Dr. Stephen Krashen's Input Hypothesis. In particular, one of the methods we will use is the TPRS (Teaching Proficiency through Reading and Storytelling) method of language instruction. This method was developed by Blaine Ray and is based on the work of Dr. James Asher.

We will focus our class time on the acquisition of high frequency structures, vocabulary, and grammatical concepts. We will use this vocabulary and content in class discussions, stories, musical activities, and cultural explorations. You will be expected to recognize them when you read or hear them and, in time, be able to produce them in speech and writing.

# In Spanish 1 the student will...

- Learn the basic past, present, and future tenses
- Learn common nouns, verbs, and adjectives used in the Spanish language
- Develop Spanish reading, writing, speaking, and listening skills
- Improve their knowledge of the cultures of Spanish speaking people
- Complete various daily activities as well as projects, presentations, essays, and a comprehensive final exam

#### Textbook & Resources

The textbook for this course is *Exprésate 1*: from Harcourt Education Company. We will also use songs, games, projects, a series of TPRS short stories and/or novels that correspond with and enhance the course textbook.

Numerous online resources will be used for this class. I will share links to many resources including class notes, summaries, practice opportunities, and YouTube videos. We will also be using google classroom, I will show you how to access this at a later time.

#### **Materials**

The following materials are required for this year-long class in order to ensure everyone is prepared and ready to be successful. Please bring the following with you every day:

- 1. Spanish Binder (1-1.5" 3-ring binder with 5 sections labeled in Spanish)

- 4. A Spanish/English dictionary is not required, but would be good to have at home.

# Student Evaluation

Quizzes, tests, homework, activities, projects, writing samples, and speaking samples are used to assess each student's learning.

Spanish I grades are determined by a weighted scale. All assignments should be saved and organized in your 3-ring binder so that you can check Power School grade postings for accuracy. The following is a breakdown of the grading categories:
